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CLINICAL CASE

- Attilio D.
- 30 years old
- Cardiovascular risk factors: active smoker
- Practicing non competitive sports activity.
- Family history: previous cardiac surgery of the father for unknown valvular disease.
- Medications: none

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CLINICAL CASE

- Cardiological history: incidental detection of elevated diastolic pressure values and heart murmur.
- Physical examination:
 - *vital signs*: BP 140/90 mmHg (bilateral), oxygen saturation 97%, pulse 70 bpm.
 - Symmetrical peripheral pulses.
 - *Heart*: S1 present, S2 present, diastolic murmur (1/4) on aortic valve area, mild midsystolic murmur under scapula; no abdominal murmur.
